1) Save the Date!

1.1) POMA AGM - 18 April 2018, Port Owen Yacht Club.

Our changed financial reporting period, which ended 31 December 2017, necessitates having the AGM earlier in the year in order to have the financial statements approved as early as possible to ensure payment of the Municipal Grant by 1 July 2018.

4) Numbering of Jetties

The Marina Manager, Mike Little, and his team will be starting to number all the private jetties with the applicable stand number. Older clients will remember that this was done in the past, but with the replacement of old wooden jetties and introduction of floating jetties it fell by the wayside. Identification of jetties is necessary to make the administration easier and more accurate.

5) Launching Permits

We wish to thank those clients whom have already collected their new permits and remind remaining clients that we would dearly love to complete this exercise by the end of February 2018.

6) Dredging

We are, unfortunately, still waiting for a reply on our request for an amendment to our dredging permit (Environmental Authority), which was lodged via our attorneys, Webber Wentzel, early in December 2017.

Advertisements calling for dredging tenders have been placed and the first site meeting with prospective contactors has been held. Final receipt and adjudication of tenders will only be able once the terms of the EA is known.

A special member and clients meeting will be held as soon as the above detail is received and dealt with.

7) Cleaning the Waterways

Nature has decided that there will not be water lettuce (Ulva) in the marina this summer! Instead we have the "fishnet weed" to deal with. The POMA team has been hard at work clearing this and we seem to be able to deal with this easier than the Ulva.

The seagrass in the Loop will be removed by the dredger as part of that operation. I am personally, looking forward to have a natural waterway teeming with juvenile fish. There are huge shoals of mullet in the waterways at the moment.

We have an exciting time ahead for the marina in 2018. I sincerely hope that we will be able to do the "Big Dredge", which will then enable us to concentrate on the other, overdue, maintenance issues such as the wooden jetties, embankments and walkways.
